U.S. health care spending grew 3.6 percent in 2013, reaching \$2.9 trillion or \$9,255 per person and represents over 17% of the U.S. GDP. Access to healthcare is a major challenge. It is also an opportunity for innovative new approaches--particularly by leveraging new partnerships and technology. This session will address those challenges and opportunities along with audience engagement and idea sharing. The expert panel includes transit providers and those involved in this access issue from the public health perspective. This session will be a learning and contribution opportunity for all conference participants to be actively engaged in developing potential solutions.

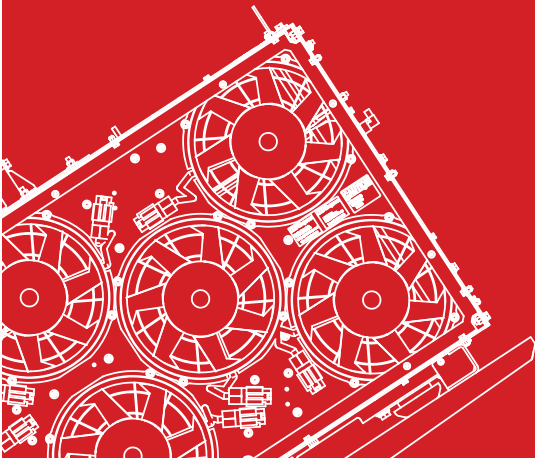
